Construction: \$80 million building permit for Methodist, renovations for AutoZone Park

The "towering" building permits continue for **Methodist University Hospital**.

In October, the hospital broke ground on a 440,000-square-foot, \$280 million tower — and now an \$80 million permit for the facility has been submitted.

The permit for "interior build-out" was filed Jan. 13 for the 1265 Union Ave. location. Turner Construction and Juan Self of **Self Tucker Architects** were listed as the contractor and architects on the permit and Mike Sheridan as the engineer.

The tower will consolidate various hospital units such as transplant services, and the West Cancer Center will relocate its Union Avenue clinic there. A building permit valued at \$15.4 million was filed for the project back in November 2016.

Tower completion is slated for 2019.

A permit valued at \$158,000 was filed for a popular Downtown Memphis attraction.

The permit for "alterations of existing lobby" was submitted for 200 Union Avenue — site of AutoZone Park.

LRK Inc. was listed as the architect, Montgomery Martin Contractors LLC as the contractor and the Memphis Redbirds as the tenant/owner.
